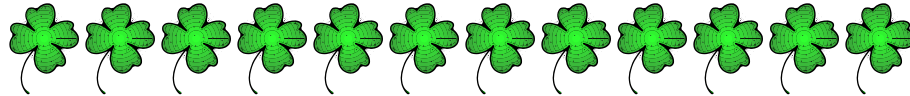

Kindergarten Registration

As a reminder to all of the parents of the children born in the year 2005, Kindergarten registration is already in full swing for the 2010 – 2011 school year. It would be a good idea to make an appointment to meet with the principal of the school you are inquiring about and ask him/her any questions that you may have regarding the school’s program, curriculum, etc. This meeting would also give you an opportunity to see the classrooms and possibly meet your child’s Kindergarten Teacher. Another thing to consider is private schools. If that may be the route you’re looking for right now is the time these schools are accepting appointments/interviews from new enrollee’s. Private
